AEDC Survey - Playing our part to build a national picture of child health

In early 2021, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families.

Children don't miss any class time, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information for the census. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level - it isn't an assessment of individual children.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census. 
Marvel of the Month

Full STEAM Ahead Day 1 @ NYPS

Report from Cluster President ~ Principal Kate Morcombe (Trawalla PS)

Amphitheatre, Trawalla, Moonambel, Navarre and Landsborough primary schools travelled to Natte Yallock for the first STEAM day of Term 2 hosted by Principal Mrs Kelly. The sun was shining and the students were excited to catch up with their friends.

To commemorate ANZAC Day the students gathered at the Natte Yallock War Memorial. The cluster captains led the service by reading the Ode of Remembrance. The Last Post was played by Bradley Saul from Timor.

As well as teaching academic skills in our schools, it is part of the core business of schools to promote student resilience, wellbeing and positive social attitudes. Each STEAM day the students are broken into their class groups to participate in Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR). Our current topic is Emotional literacy. Emotional Literacy can be defined as the ability to understand ourselves and other people. It includes the ability to understand, express and manage our own emotions, build empathy, and to respond appropriately to the emotions of others. Building a large vocabulary for emotions helps to increase emotional literacy and build self-awareness and empathy for others. This has been done through a range of activities including reading books, drawing faces to represent emotions, sharing ideas about feelings and relating then to personal experiences.

Music continued to teach songs to sing on camp as well as playing instruments. The Foundation - 4 students played recorders and the 5-6 students started learning how to play guitars and keyboards with Mr Tromp and Mrs Kelly.

In PE with Mr Franc, the students worked on hand-eye coordination by participating in a series of challenging ball activities. All senior students were invited to try out for the cross country inter-school competition. The try out was run at lunchtime today. Well done to the students who participated in this activity.

The Age Group Champion Medallions were presented to the winners from the recent Pyrenees Athletics Day. Congratulations to Connor, Milly B, Sah Sah, Xavier, Clara, Ramone and Milly J.

The Science lessons today have been exploring a Rube Goldberg machine named after the American cartoonist Rube Goldberg. The machine or contraption is a chain reaction-type machine intentionally designed to perform a simple task in an indirect and overly complicated way. Each of the students invented their own machine to perform an everyday task such as brushing teeth, turning on a light switch, feeding the dog etc... The students drew designs for their ideas.
