From the Principal...

We are officially half way through Term 3 and learning is steaming ahead in both core and extra-curricular areas. We have experienced a high number of absences due to illness recently and look forward to welcoming everyone back to school recovered and healthy this week.

Last week I attended the Central Highlands Area Principal Forum in Ballarat. It was the first time in several years that all Central Highlands Principals have been in a room together and was an informative and uplifting day of professional development and collegial interaction with a focus on 'Leading Learning and Wellbeing'.

Some of the topics we covered were:

- Implementing the recently approved Victorian Government Schools
 Agreement
- * Case studies from schools to demonstrate how that are implementing the priority initiatives of disability, inclusion and mental health.
- * The Mental Health Toolkit, and
- * Numeracy in Schools

As a staff, we will be looking further in the Mathematics Teaching Toolkit and continuing to work with the ASSIST initiative as part of our ongoing professional learning in Numeracy Teaching.

The whole staff also attended Community Understanding and Safety (CUST) training last week. This session was of great value to support all staff to feel confident in delivering the Victorian Curriculum with the inclusion of cultural perspectives, highlighting resources and regional contacts that can give support in these areas. On our return to school, staff immediately began to identify resources already present at Natte Yallock Primary School to ensure we are bringing an indigenous perspective through in our literacy, numeracy and visual arts lessons.

Wet Weather at Play Time



FSA Cluster Day Monday 8th August

Our Full Steam Ahead at Landsborough last week delivered a warm sunny day after a cool frosty start. At the morning assembly, cluster captain Ellie from Navarre read the Acknowledgement of Country. Students who represented the Pyrenees Cluster in the recent Maryborough Basketball competition were presented with certificates to commemorate the day. A big thanks to cluster staff Mr Franc, Mrs Miller, Mr Tromp and Lachie Drummond for supporting the students on this day.

At Landsborough, the students in Year Six participated in Art Therapy with Marie Badaja. The students were given a wide range of art materials that included watercolour paints, acrylic paints, permanent makers, glue sticks and an art journal. These are kept in their art folio. The aim of the program is to support students' transition from a small primary school to a larger secondary school, one focus is to develop skills and strategies to care for their belongings – a skill that will be very important in secondary school next year.

Resilience, Rights & Respectful Relationships with Foundation explored Who I am? Different things to know about me. Year 1/2 lessons were about help-seeking from peers. Year 3/4 completed the topic of stress management by learning relaxation techniques. Years 5/6 students designed cluster T shirts for the this year's Year 6 cohort and the Year 5s for next year.

The PE classes used the wide-open spaces of the Landsborough oval to conduct football skill lessons. The students worked on their own, in small groups and as teams to apply the skills of handballing, running and marking the football.

The art classes linked their activity to the Birmingham Commonwealth Games. The finished artworks showcased the wide variety of sports on display in the games. Each athlete silhouette was mounted onto a background of colourful shapes that were created by ruling lines in black texta.

Science commenced a new topic, studying endangered animals. Students learnt why animals can become endangered. These reasons include: overhunting or overharvesting, habitat loss, pollution, human-wildlife conflict, disease, low birth rate and small population.

Our next FSA day is Monday August 22nd at Landsborough.
