

We would like to propose starting 'Pie Day Friday' to help raise funds to support firstly the fairy garden and then maybe items for the kitchen/café play space.




We would like to begin this fundraising effort on the first Friday of Term 3 and bring a progress report to the school council by the end of the term.

Curriculum Links & Success Criteria



Full STEAM Ahead

Day 4 @ NYPS

All schools in the Pyrenees Cluster travelled to Natte Yallock for our final FSA day for Term 2. After a cool, frosty start across the Pyrenees, we were greeted with a sunny day.

The Art sessions, led by Mrs Slater and Miss Grace from Navarre school, provided all of the students another opportunity to apply their skills to create works of art using tissue paper. This is the technique that they learnt last FSA day with guest artist, Patricia Mullins. The students were more confident with the medium this time around. The students were also given their completed art from previous weeks to take back to their schools. These will go on display in schools. They are all very proud of the finished products.

In Music, Mrs Kelly from Natte Yallock and Mr Tromp from Moonambel provided a lesson of recorder for the Foundation to Year four students. They are learning to produce a sweet clear sound – the sound of a squeaking recorder is what they are trying to avoid. The five and six students are learning to play the song “Don’t Worry, Be Happy” on the guitar and the keyboard. They will continue to work on this song next term.

Students have been invited to join a Pyrenees Cluster Choir that will perform at the Royal South Street Competition in Ballarat on Monday August 23rd, 2021. The students have been practicing two songs; Listen to the Rain and My Island Home. The students have been meeting at lunchtime to practice their singing. A big thanks to Mrs Kelly and Mr Tromp for facilitating this experience.

The timetable today allowed for an extra-long Science session. The student were continuing to learn about Rube Goldberg, the challenge today was to complete a simple task in the most convoluted way. Students in years three to six had to build a machine that took 3-6 steps and prep to two students had to include 5 steps. The task was a choice between building a marble run or creating a machine to pop a balloon.

Next term the Pyrenees Cluster Full STEAM Ahead days will be at Navarre school. The dates are:

Some Prep - 6 student have volunteered to create a Cluster Choir to perform in the Royal South Street competition on Monday August 23 at Her Majesties Theatre. The Music department staff, Mrs Kelly and Mr Tromp have been conducting practice during lunchtime of FSA days. The choir are learning to perform two songs; Listen to the Rain by Dulcie Holland and My Island Home by Neil Murray. This week’s practice brings the promise of a lovely sounding choir!


