A huge thank you to our group of volunteer workers who banded together to complete the construction work.





What a fantastic influence the Tokyo Olympics have been! We are thoroughly enjoying bringing the games into all areas of our curriculum. We officially opened our NYPS Potato Olympics last week and have scheduled events to take us right through to a closing ceremony this Friday.

Event 1: Rolling

Potato athletes were let loose down a ramp and the winner (determined by measurement) was the athlete who travelled the most distance.

Event 2: Target

Potato athletes were rolled with precision to reach the centre of a target and collect the most points.

Event 3: Velodrome

Potato athletes rolled around the velodrome. Distances were measured in fractional amounts determined by the quarter markers on the arena.

Event 4: Diving

Potato athletes leapt from a high diving platform. The winner was determined by who achieve the biggest splashed. Distances were calculated by chalk marks around the water marks made on the concrete and then measured.

Event 5: Gymnastics

Potato athletes balanced on beams which were slowly removed. The potato able to balance on the least amount of beams was the winner.

Event 6: Spinning (still to come)

Potato athletes will attempt an on the spot spin which will be measured in full turns.

Event 7: Weight Lifting (still to come)

Potato athletes will stand still and support as many unifix as possible. The athlete who can support the most is the winner.
